Lingvistická část zkoušky vychází z textu. Požaduje se čtení textu s uplatněním fonetickofonologických principů angličtiny, a dále adekvátní překlad textu do češtiny. Teoretické lingvistické pojednání může být rovněž založeno na konkrétních jevech vyskytujících se v textu.

Tématický okruh MORFOLOGIE je zaměřen zejména na témata:

- word-classes and group (phrase) structures
- nouns classification, grammatical categories (countability, number, determination, gender, case)
- verbs classification, forms, grammatical categories (person, number, tense, mood, aspect, voice)
- adverbs classes, grammatical categories
- adjectives classes, grammatical categories
- pronouns classes, grammatical categories
- numerals
- prepositions
- conjunctions

Tématický okruh SYNTAX:

- elements of clause structure and their realisations
- thematic and information structures
- types of sentences simple and complex

- existential clauses

Tématický okruh LEXIKOLOGIE:

- semantic classification (semantic fields, hyponomies, taxonomies, meronomies)

FINAL STATE EXAMINATION - LINGUISTIC PART

- 1. The examination consists of three parts:
- the reading and translation of a <u>TEXT</u>, where the aim is to apply the phonetic and phonological principles of English in oral production, as well as to demonstrate proper understanding of the text in adequate Czech equivalence;
- a topic from <u>MORPHOLOGY</u>: word-classes and their reference, semantic and grammatical classification within word-classes, grammatical categories and their manifestations, the characteristics of the Nominal Group (Noun Phrase), the Adjectival Group, the Adverbial Group, the Prepositional Group, the Verbal Group (Verb Phrase), syntactic functions of word-classes;
- a topic from either LEXICOLOGY or SYNTAX
 - lexicology: the lexeme and its meaning, semantic change, word-groups (collocations and idioms), sense relations (synonymy, antonymy, homonymy, polysemy), semantic classification (semantic fields, hyponomies, taxonomies, meronomies), lexical innovation (neologisms, lexical borrowing, conversion, word-formation), lexicography;
 - syntax: elements of clause structure and their realisations, thematic and information structures, types of sentences, syntactic and semantic relationships, embedding and dependency, types of dependent clauses (esp. relative clauses, conditional clauses), existential clauses, projection.

The candidates are expected to demonstrate an understanding of the system of English grammar as represented in the relations between lexis, grammatical forms, syntactic, semantic and textual functions. They are also expected to be able to present the topic coherently, in a way appropriate to the teaching of English.

The candidates are required to present a reading list of items of professional literature used as sources of their study.
