## **Examination Format.**

## The oral exam in EFL Didactics 2 will include three parts.

## 1. Discussion of the following theoretical issues:

- 1. Oral communication skills in ELT research. Spoken language: varieties of speech genre.
- 2. Common European Framework of Reference and its six attainment levels. Descriptors for speaking.
- 3. The unity of knowledge and skills in language teaching. Views on micro- and macroskills of oral communication.
- 4. Types of classroom speaking performance. Principles for teaching speaking skills.
- 5. Paradigm of activities for teaching speaking. Communicative activities.
- 6. Maximising speaking opportunities and facilitating autonomous language use.
- 7. Pictures as stimuli for speaking.
- 8. Types of elicits. Scaffolding techniques. Strategies for correcting oral mistakes.
- 9. Designing assessment tasks for intensive and responsive speaking.
- 10. Teaching writing. CEFR levels for writing.
- 11. Writing as a social process. Types of classroom writing.
- 12. Classroom management.
- 13. Planning and conducting a lesson. Main planning elements.
- 14. A question of your own choice.

## 2. Reflection on a particular area of teaching competence.

Select relevant can-do descriptors from the EPOSTL.

Reflect on them, back them up with practical suggestions, **justify** your solution. (For this you should use the reflective papers you have been assigned during the semester and the dossier built up during your practicum.) What skills as a language teacher do you need to further improve?

3. **Practical task to be designed impromptu**. You will get teaching materials (a text for reading or listening, a picture/pictures, song lyrics, etc.) and will have to suggest a set of activities in order to achieve a certain objective.

For example, "Reflect upon the following picture. Suggest some activities to use it as a stimulus for oral work at A1 level."

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
