University of J. E. Purkyně (UJEP) in Ústí nad Labem is a friendly college, where students can find comfortable and amiable background of modern assembly halls, lecture halls, study rooms and dormitories together with canteens. Students encounter with collegial attitude of the academics and helpfulness from workers of study, foreign and other departments of the faculties as well as the rector's office.

The amount of activities students take part in within their studies (excursions, studies and sojourns abroad, projects cooperation, working in labs with their tutors) creates ideal conditions for friendship among mates, students with similar professional interests and their pedagogues. Such relationships can be strengthened within the course of three, five and more years by a number of out-of-school activities organized by the Students Union, Erasmus Student Network or sports clubs and music bands.

Ústí nad Labem University is now a family of 7,500 students, taught and taken care of by 950 university employees. Based on a variety of studied fields, the university is divided into eight faculties. These are the backbone of UJEP as a whole and present a stable and compact offer of studied programmes and their specializations. The wide variety of options allows every individual to make their choices according to their nature, interest, study needs and priorities. Our student maintains their individuality and shapes into an educated personality.

UJEP is a home and it offers responsive environment to students while they study there.

The text of the brochure is supplemented by images of students' home lives in apartments or at the dormitory. The exaggeration used with pictures accompanying individual faculties proves the students' real zest in their fields and underlines the intention to introduce UJEP as a temporary home to all its students.

University

The Jan Evangelista Purkyně University in Ústí nad Labem (UJEP) was founded in 1991. It is a modern scientific, teach-ing and cultural education centre of the Ústí nad Labem region. The UJEP educates more than 7,500 students and employs 950 members of staff.

The university is stable from the comprehensive aspect

The UJEP has successfully completed the composition of its faculties. It offers study candidates a wide and comprehensive range of study fields from various areas of human activity. There continues to be a great interest in study at our university. We receive more than 7,000 applications per year. There continues to be great interest in the fields of the humanities and social sciences, and there is less interest in technical and science fields, in spite of the measures which the university has introduced over recent years for the greater fulfilment of these socially desirable fields.

The university has 8 faculties:

Faculty of Social and Economic Studies, Faculty of Art and Design, Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Health Studies, Faculty of Environment, Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Education and Faculty of Science





Study

Tens of disciplines and study combinations

At UJEP the offer of study opportunities covers the study of technical, scientific, environmental, economic, social, social-science, health and teaching disciplines as well as creative arts. From the aspect of the availability of study it applies that every fifth discipline is offered in combined (distance) form, and as such is also suitable for employed candidates. Those interested can select either single-discipline study or a dual-discipline combination. With its offer of single-discipline studies the university accommodates those who want to specialise to a greater extent professionally, whereas those whose field of interest is broader or who want to improve their prospects after gaining a diploma prefer dual-discipline study.

All stages of higher education – an opportunity for the talented

The highly diverse spectrum of study disciplines makes it possible to satisfy those candidates who prefer professionally focused bachelor's study and those who wish to achieve a master's or doctoral level of higher education. And the offer of doctoral studies (for example in the area of engineering technologies, computer methods or environmental analytical chemistry) also attracts highly talented students to the university, for whom it becomes a path to prestigious employment in the field of science, research, development, art or top management of domestic and foreign firms.



UJEP is a good entry ticket to the labour market

Every year 2,000 graduates leave the university, and the vast majority of them enter the labour market successfully or go on to a higher level of university education. The overall success rate of UJEP graduates expressed through recalculation from the standardised level of unemployed graduates reaches 94%. All parts of the university offer the assurance of good employment prospects, and together they all ensure the formation of a positive profile of the graduate, both from the aspect of finding a position in the matter studied and from the aspect of his or her flexibility.

Education for The EU

All UJEP graduates gain a Diploma Supplement allowing transparent and unified acknowledgment of higher education and professional qualifications in EU countries and making it easier for graduates to enter the European labour market.

Creative research, self-fulfilment and opportunities

For students, entry to the university opens up access to the latest findings and their application. Naturally tuition at the university is linked with the scientific, research or artistic activity of the faculties, and it offers students a rare opportunity to discuss matters openly with leading scientists, artists and teachers from the Czech Republic and abroad, to get involved in research teams and learn how to present the results of their creative activities in a high-quality manner. Students who want to experience, discover, create and develop are afforded access to thousands of specialist publications and many electronic information sources, they have at their disposal the libraries, reading rooms, laboratories with modern equipment, studios and other facilities of the departments, and special scholarships are offered to them. Every year the very best, those who are successful with their expert results in renowned magazines or who are placed in prestigious art competitions, are awarded the Rector's Prize.





Linkage of study with experience

A strong link between study and experience is a priority for all UJEP faculties. Professional experience and excursions constitute a natural part of study in the professionally focused disciplines. Bachelor's and master's theses, which are based on the needs of companies, small and medium firms, and state and non-state institutions and organisations, constitute the main bridge between study and experience these days.

The Competition Ústí nad Labem Region Thesis, in which students of the final years of higher education can submit their bachelor's and master's theses associated with the development of the Ústí nad Labem region, tends to be successful for students of our university in particular. In this way they contribute during their study to the development of the region in the area of strategic decision making, the environment, sociology and, for example, visual communication.

One term spent abroad is a given


One of UJEP's priorities is internationalisation. Hundreds of its students have studied at tens of universities in Europe or overseas for one or more terms. Up to a fifth of graduates receive part of their education at foreign universities. With ERASMUS financial support students can go abroad from the second year of study, and in addition to a one-semester or two-semester study exchange they can also undergo several months of a practical internship in a foreign company, training or research centre or other organisation. For a study exchange they can choose from almost 200 contractual foreign higher education institutions in 27 European countries. And every year there are up to 300 places available for UJEP students!

Programme ERASMUS+

The history of the Erasmus+ programme dates back to 1987 when approved as an individual programme of the European Union, focused on university students mobility. It was named after Erasmus of Rotterdam (1466–1536), Dutch thinker, humanist and theologian, called "the lord of humanists" because he outgrew all others with his range of knowledge and wit. ERASMUS is, however, also an acronym for EuRopean Community Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students. Since its inception, the programme has undergone a series of changes. The scope of programme activities has been gradually enriched with teachers mobility and transnational cooperation projects among universities. In 1995, Erasmus became a part of the framework of the Socrates programme, replaced in 2007–2013 by the Lifelong Learning Programme. In 2014, the European Union gave the entire learning programme its name Erasmus+ for the period of 2014–2020. This programme supports cooperation and mobility in all spheres of education, training, and fields of youth activities and sports.

The Czech Republic joined the Erasmus programme in 1997. The first Czech students and teachers were sent abroad under this programme in 1998/1999.

The first students from the University of Jan Evangelista Purkyně in Ústí nad Labem (UJEP) went abroad to study in the academic year 1999/2000. Since then, more than 2,500 students and 1,200 employees of UJEP have participated in foreign stays in the Erasmus programme. Erasmus+ mobility has an exchangeable character; thus in the same way students of UJEP and UJEP staff stay abroad and learn through experience as well as foreign students and staff arrive to study, teach or train at UJEP.



Rector's Prizes

At the end of each year, upon the occasion of the birthday of the Ústí nad Labem university's founder, the UJEP rectors offer Rector's Prizes to academic staff and students for extraordinary activities and results attained in the calendar year. With these prizes they express their admiration and respect for the performed work of our alma mater's staff and students.

Generous scholarship programme

The overall volume of provided scholarships has reached CZK 72.8 million! CZK 28 million was paid out in accommodation grants, CZK 19 million for foreign mobility, CZK 2.2 million for social grants, CZK 3.6 million in grants for good results, CZK 5.5 million for doctoral scholarships, and CZK 14.5 million fir extraordinary scholarships.

The best students are also awarded: Scholarship of the Mayor of Ústí n. L., scholarships of mayors of city wards Ústí n. L., Scholarship of Mayor of City of Trmice, Scholarship of Statutory City of Teplice, Scholarship of Economic and Social Council of Ústí nad Labem Region, o.s., for Best Student in Technical Disciplines, Scholarship of Director of VZP, branch Ústí nad Labem, and Scholarship of Oborová zdravotní pojišťovna for Best Student of UJEP FHS, Scholarship of Director of ZPMV ČR for Best Bachelor's Thesis in the field of healthcare.

Whole-life education

Whole-life education at UJEP is an important part of educational activity. As part of whole-life education, courses are offered such as complementary, specialisation, requalification and expansion study, as well as University of the Third Age and preparatory courses for study at an institute of higher education. Study is either full time or in combined form.

Study in whole-life education programmes and courses is offered by the UJEP Whole-Life Education Department and also the individual faculties (social-economic, Mechanical Engineering, teaching and science).

We are attractive for children and seniors

The University of the Third Age has existed at UJEP since 1994. Every year senior citizens are expressing an increasing interest in study. On average 450–550 students now take the winter and summer semester.

For several years now the university has been implementing a project focussing on making science accessible not only to secondary school children, but to the very youngest too. At present the project Open University, Open Science is following up on the successful project This is Science, Get To Know It. As part of the project the university is carrying out the successful project Teen Age University, based on a simulation of the course of the academic year and character of higher education (applications, enrolment, matriculation, "study" in the selected programme, graduation) for pupils from primary and secondary school from the ages of 8 to 12 and 13 and above.

Quality conditions for the disabled

UJEP has gained a financial grant from the European Social Fund from the operational programme Education for Competitiveness as part of the project "University Centre of Support for Students with Specific Educational Needs" for the creation of a University Centre of Support for Students with Specific Educational Needs. Thanks to this we will make the fields accredited in the UJEP as accessible as possible to disabled students. These include people with movement disabilities, with sensory disabilities – the blind and those with impaired vision, the deaf and hard of hearing – and people with other medical disability or disadvantage and students from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds. In this way we will ensure them the optimal conditions, including support services.





UJEP scientific library

The UJEP Scientific Library ensures comprehensive library and information services at the university (gathering, processing, preservation and affording access to the library and information collection).

The new modern building of the library stands on high pillars directly on the UJEP Campus. It is divided up into departments dealing with the collections and the services department. It provides lending services for those wishing to take materials away or study them on site, the copying and scanning of documents, access to electronic databases (bibliographic and fulltext), search services and others. One part of the free selection are study places (there are a total of 106 places, including study booths, a stylish reception desk, internet information workplace and winter garden. The pass of a UJEP student or employee serves as a library card (chip card) after registration in the library.

The European Documentation Centre operates within the context of the university and affords access to the publications of the European Union and Austrian library.



Halls of residence

The accommodation grant is one of the highest in the Czech Republic

UJEP pays up to CZK 1,000 per month to students who have a right to an accommodation grant. So in terms of the level of paid accommodation grant the university is one of the leading Czech higher education institutions.

Everyone gets halls of accommodation with internet

The university has sufficient space for students at the halls of residence - every year all applicants for halls are accommodated there. A given standard for accommodation in halls of residence is internet access and connection to the web in every room, and the students pay only for electrical energy. Internet reading rooms with non-stop operation are also available for those in halls. But there is more to university halls of residence than just rooms – they include the facilities, kitchenettes, washing machines and driers available to students.

The halls of residence represent the centre of many student activities, and students spend their leisure time there. In the area of the halls there are playing fields, courts and a gym, as well as a university club where concerts, discos and social events are held. Here it is possible to utilise the social rooms, study rooms and play table tennis or table football.







Leisure time

The arts

Students with a bent for the arts can study at a faculty with an arts focus (FUD), and also at the departments of art education, creative culture and Czech Studies of the FE.

In addition they can visit our choirs and musical ensembles:

Students of the FAD frequently win student competitions in the field of design, glass and ceramic creation and photography. And students of the Department of Music Teaching of the FE win leading awards at international competitions for choirs and musical interpretation. In the complex of the building in the street České mládeže the Film Club Aula shows films.

Sport

UJEP offers sports oriented students opportunities in and around the sports hall in the street České mládeže, where they will find a functional laboratory, tennis and beach volleyball courts, a large gym and small gym for gymnastics, weights room, martial arts hall, indoor athletics track and climbing and bouldering wall. The small and large gym and the weights room are available in the building in Hoření Street. At the halls of residence K1 in Klíše you can exercise in the gym and use the tennis and beach volleyball courts.

Students can also sign up for USK Slavie and participate in sports in individual teams (aerobics, basketball, beach volleyball, floorball, climbing, bodybuilding, modern and sports gymnastics etc.). The university also owns the Bukovina exercise centre in the Český ráj area. Students of the Department of Physical Education and Sport of the FE mainly contribute to the sporting successes and good name of the UJEP at the Academic Championships of the Czech Republic, the Championships of the Czech Republic, the European and World Championships and the Olympic Games.

In the city

The regional capital offers a wide range of cultural facilities (Mumie Experimental Space, Theatre Studio, North Bohemia Theatre Opera) and many cafes, bars and clubs. In the complex of the building in the street České mládeže the Film Club Aula shows films.

The actual city of Ústí nad Labem offers facilities for athletics, basketball, martial arts, cycling, fitness, football, handball, climbing, horse riding, skittles, ice hockey, skiing, swimming, skateboard, tennis, hiking, rowing and water polo. For these activities the students can use the swimming pool in Brno, the city football stadium, the city spa, the swimming complex Klíše, saunas, the ice rink, ski complex Zadní Telnice, and the athletics tracks in Adolfov, Nakléřov and in Tisá.





Study in the university city

Some students of the first years have the good luck to start their study directly in the university city which is being built in the centre of the city. The campus is also home to the Multifunctional Information and Education Centre, which includes the new all-university UJEP Science Library, the UJEP Rectorate and the new shared lecture halls.

The campus is facing further extensive construction over the years to come. The buildings F1 and F2 will be rebuilt for the Faculty of Arts, an in the area freed up by demolition a common centre with shared laboratories will be created for the Faculty of Science, Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and Faculty of the Environment – Science and Technical Disciplines Centre.

The university's education and research facilities, as well as administrative and operative ones, will be brought together on an area of 90,000 m². The entire area will be connected optically with the neighbouring complex of the pedagogical faculty. Another, so-called service, part will be connected to this basic campus complex, and it will offer accommoda-tion and dining capacities, as well as areas for sport and leisure activities, including parking facilities. The entire cam-pus is conceived for the future as a complex full of greenery, serving not only the students and staff, but also the general public and citizens of Ústí nad Labem.



Student activities

Student Union

The Union has now organised the Majáles student festival, an extensive music event connected in recent years with the ÚL-LET freeride cycling downhill race, a total of five times. At the start of the new academic year the SU organises a One-Day Multigenre Festival or Welcome Freshers. The annual Christmas event with the apposite name JEŽUCH has become an inseparable part of student life at UJEP.

The New Slipper Party is another Student Union event. This successful student music event is nothing new at the university and has a tradition in the musical evenings held at the halls of residence where students left their rooms to meet up in their slippers. The Student Union organises the programme completely, including Czech and foreign bands, the PA and evening's dramaturgy.

The traditional formal UJEP balls are popular and attended by many students and academics. In 2013 the UJEP Student Union once again ensured the holding of the ball after winning a public tender.

Students Chamber of Senatus Academicus (SKAS)

Students Chamber of Senatus Academicus of J. E. Purkyně University consists of students who won seats during the Senatus Academicus elections; Senatus Academicus (that is Academic Senate and as such being the university's supreme academic body). Their office allows them to have an insight into the structures of their alma and also see throughout the Senatus Academicus itself; here they form 2/5 of its representatives. The students can notably intervene with the direction of the whole institution. The senators may be members or heads of Senatus Academicus boards and can be highly





specialized in issues that are pivotal for them. Such groups are, namely, economic and legislative boards as well as, for example, Board of Students' Affairs. Student senators then traditionally partake in the rector's committee together with, but not only, a number of colleges.

Student activities

The UJEP university volleyball league, called Klíšovka, is now in its second year and has become very popular.

The Academic Sports Centre organises interesting sporting events for UJEP students and staff. In addition to the Klíšov-ka volleyball league, these include tournaments in basketball, bowling and tournaments for individuals in playing the new EA FIFA 13 on PS3 and Xbox360 consoles.

The students actively participate in the writing of several university magazines. These are the university-wide magazine Zpravodaj UJEP and faculty magazines such as Activum, the student magazine of the Faculty of Science, or ERGO, the magazine of the Faculty of Arts.

Other student activities

Students are involved in tutorial activities while helping foreign students arriving at UJEP for their short-term sojourns, getting involved in the academia environment of the university and finding one's way in town. Within the students' organization Erasmus Student Network excursions, cultural as well as sports and other party activities are organized.

UJEP and the Ústí nad Labem public

The university invites the Ústí nad Labem public to its lecture halls for interesting meetings, discussions and implemented lectures. Jointly with us the citizens of Ústí nad Labem met ex-presidents Václav Havel and Václav Klaus, as well as important politicians, ministers and senators.

The university implements events focussing directly on the public of the region. These are the **Days of Science and Art** at the **UJEP**, meetings of scientists and the public in an informal environment of cafes and clubs under the name **Café Nobel**, with the alternative for children **Decaf Café Nobel**, the fun, interactive **PF fest** of the Faculty of Education directly in the atrium of the Ústí nad Labem City Hall, or the science fair and circuses with their popular themes. Last, but not least, are the **UJEP balls** or the **Majáles** student festivals, some of the most significant cultural events of the winter and spring season.

For several years now the greenhouse of the **Educational Botanical Park** of our Faculty of Science has organised exhibitions of tropical orchids and carnivorous plants, which have attracted many visitors.

The UJEP choirs give regular performances in the concert halls of the Ústí nad Labem region, not only at Easter and Christmas, but also as part of thematic concerts or presentations of important composers and instrumentalists. The field of music includes the organisation of the **Jirkovský Písňovar**, a highly popular competitive choral festival for popular music, of which our Faculty of Education is a partner.

Our scientists and historians also play an important role in the cultural and educational activities of the city.





Exhibition spaces

The Faculty of Art and Design works closely with the Emil Filla Gallery, where there are traditionally not only exhibitions of master's theses, but also other interesting projects on which many of the faculty's teachers work. Currently the university is holding the aegis over exhibitions organised by students of the department of curation studies in the Gallery Armaturka, Gallery Rampa and other spaces. The Design Exhibition Hall, which is part of the Ceramic Design Studio in Dubí near Teplice is also important.

Předlice University Project

This focusses on site-specific works in the field of art, design and graphic design with the theme of Předlice as a residential quarter - socially excluded and industrial – with the complexes of certain large firms founded mainly in the 1930s. It identifies evidently the largest socially excluded community in the Ústí nad Labem region and analyses the mechanisms and local principles. In cooperation with invited experts it defines the possibilities of mutual existence for the city's inhabitants. The project illustrates the worsening social climate where there is an internal emigration of inhabitants of excluded localities detached from the basic principles of democratic society.



FSE

The faculty prepares highly qualified specialists, bachelors, and engineers for the public and private sectors in three bachelor's and two extended master's study programs. The economics study programs are focused on business administration and management, financial management, and regional development; another study program is oriented towards social work.

Because of this, graduates find well-paid positions not only in business, but also in state administration and self-administration. Bachelor's studies are conducted in both daily and distance learning formats. The extended master's studies are currently only offered in the form of daily studies.

Classes are conducted in classrooms equipped with modern, advanced technology. Computer rooms and an internet café are available for students directly within the faculty building. The faculty also has at its disposal a language laboratory which is equipped with modern hardware and software.

FUD

The Faculty of Art and Design provides a complex, three-degree education in specialisations focused on the spheres of art and design.

Students in the studios dedicate themselves to a wide spectrum of artistic activities from free art through applied art, design and also, partially, architecture. Practical study is supplemented by theoretical in the field of curatorial studies focused on contextualizations, the production and marketing of modern art and the socialization of visual works. Doctoral study in the field of Visual Communication is also offered at the FUD. In this field one can also gain entry to the process leading to a higher doctorate (habilitation) and to nomination as a professor.

The faculty is housed in a newly reconstructed building situated on the university campus. The building provides a high-quality base for the activities of individual studios, not only as regards spatial arrangement, but primarily thanks to development in the technological equipment of its workshops and other specialised workplaces.


The faculty setting offers quality conditions for study, but also workshop spaces and laboratories with advanced technology in the faculty buildings.

FZS

The Faculty of Health Studies educates students in non-medical health fields – Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, General Nursing, and Midwifery.

In the field of science and research the faculty departments focus on problems which are closely tied to education within our fields of study. The laboratory of the study of movement focuses on the fields of biomechanics and kinesthesiology. In the laboratory for research on diseases of civilization, students of FZS follow the occurrence of risk factors in cardiovascular diseases in the population of the Ústí region and the development of venous thromboembolism in women using hormonal contraceptives. The center for the protection and support of health provides a base for research activity in the field following lifestyle levels of the whole population, including children, pregnant women, and senior citizens.

Courses at the FZS are conducted in specialized school classrooms and in real workplace settings for health and social care.

FŽP

The Faculty of the Environment is focused on research and education in the wide field of ecology and the environment. Its location predetermines it to finding solutions for urgent ecological problems in the northern part of the Czech Republic. Emphasis is placed on the study of causes for the disruption of basic environmental elements, on the possibilities and means for their recovery, and especially on preventive measures within the field of environmental work and protection.

A principle of multidisciplinarity and flexibility is asserted within the study and research program, with a well-bal-anced proportion of the disciplines of natural science, technology, economics and information. The faculty has a three-year bachelor's program and a two-year master's program, in the form of daily studies and distance learning studies. The faculty also implements a doctoral program in the field of Environmental Analytic Chemistry.

The faculty has at its disposal classroom spaces, computer and specialized classrooms and laboratories. The faculty also conducts studies at its branch in Most-Velebudice.

The Faculty of Arts is oriented toward educa-tion and scholarly research in the humanities. It is the only humanities oriented faculty in Northwest-ern and Northern Czech Republic which offers daily university education at all levels of study (Bachelor's, Master's, Ph.D.) to future scholars in fields of the hu-manities and to teachers of primary and secondary schools. The faculty also has the right to offer habil-itation processes and procedures leading to nomina-tion as professor in the field of Czech History.

A part of the Faculty of Arts is the Institute for Slavic-Germanic Studies (USGS) which conducts research activities in the fields of Czech-German relations and the history of the German and Czech countries.

Students in all departments are offered high-quality premises (studies and libraries), equipped with their completely unique Center for the Documentation and Digitalization of Cultural Heritage at the Department of History which, thanks to the helpful cooperation of the FŽP at UJEP, connects humanities oriented study with technical and natural sciences, especially in the field of geoinformatics.
